### Origins of Pink Shirt Day

Pink Shirt Day began in Canada in 2007 when two students took a stand against homophobic bullying after a new Year 10 student was harassed and threatened for wearing pink. These students bought dozens of pink shirts and distributed them to their classmates to wear the next day.

The word got out online and hundreds of students showed up in pink, some from head-to-toe, to stand together against bullying.

It has been celebrated in New Zealand since 2009.

### **Science**

The Mokoia Intermediate Science programme could not move forward without the support of external providers and fellow schools. From our initial support from Whakatane intermediate, to our research lab support from Wellington University and Operational lab support from Rotorua Lakes District council, we are so very grateful.

We are fortunate to have a science lab for our students. Utuhina Tech science focus is the material world, strand level 4, year 8.

Science extension is open to year 7s and 's every Thursday afternoon. Due to popular demand, an overflow class has been created on Friday mornings.

On Thursday, a small group of water focussed students visited the operational lab at the water treatment plant. Our students made quite a positive impression with thorough inquisitive discussion and lists of well prepared questions.

In the afternoon, our solar cell students were discussing their investigation with Dr Nathaniel Davies, senior chemistry lecturer from Wellington University, on zoom.

One of our highlights today was a gift of a Nepenthes Carnivorous plant from Chris at the water treatment lab. The students have named him 'Brad'.
