

Well done Angus!

A penguin-headed dip stick used to test the temperature of drinks was the brainchild of **Angus Macklin**, 11, who took out Scion's Morph competition last week.

The competition followed the 4D printing workshop held by Scion at Te Aka Mauri Rotorua Library during the April school holidays.

At the workshop, the 25 tamariki who attended were encouraged to create a design in the user-friendly 3D CAD tool, Tinkercad, that was not only printable but useful when it came to Morph's thermochromic properties.

Morph is a new flexible 4D printing filament developed at Scion which is now commercially available through New Zealand's leading filament manufacturer, Imagin Plastics.

Its thermochromic properties give the filament its fourth dimension, changing colour when it senses a temperature shift.

Angus' winning design granted him access to explore Scion's labs alongside the team behind the innovative technology.

Angus joined Scion scientist **Angelique Greene** and technician **Ben Davy** last Friday to explore Scion's chemistry and 3D printing labs, where he got to see a large 3D printer up close and helped set up the printer that printed his dipstick design using the new filament.

He says he enjoyed seeing the variety of research at Scion, and hadn't previously realised all the different ways they applied science. He especially liked touring the timber department with all of its machinery.
