Our reports look a little differently this year. Below is a brief explanation of each part to help you understand what you are seeing.

Curriculum Areas - Radial Dials


These show the percentage of progressions your child has achieved or is working on at each level.

Green is achieved and yellow are any goals (next steps) in their learning.

Curriculum Areas -Curriculum Level Graphs

This shows the Overall Teacher Judgement that your child's teacher has made in Literacy and Numeracy. It is one specific curriculum level. Each half level has been broken in to Introductory, Achieved and Excellence. This allows for more progress to be seen within the level.





Readiness to Learn - Class, PE, Technology

This looks at the student as a person, the effort and attitude they put into class everyday.

Te Whare o Manuwa

Te Whare o Manawa is split into five categories which are taha tinana, taha wairua, taha hinengaro, taha whānau, and taha kōmingo. Each taha has 4 aspects which relate to that taha and we view as a means to strengthen the ākonga in that taha.

We use manawa taki, manawa āki, manawa ora, manawa toa as a measure of the progress that the ākonga has made in each of these aspects. Each of these levels shows that the ākonga is progressing in that aspect and manawa toa indicates that the ākonga has progressed to the top of that aspect.

Te Whare o Manawa is both a Graduate Profile for the ākonga at the end of their two years in Rūmaki and a report of their progress while they are in Rūmaki.


