Note to Whānau - We here at Woolworths Pharmacy Rotorua (Formerly Countdown Pharmacy Rotorua) would like to inform that our pharmacy is now able to provide free treatments for Headlice and Scabies for anyone over the age of 2 via a short pharmacist consultation (usually 5-10 minutes). This service is funded and will enable the public to more easily access Headlice and Scabies treatments without prescription and also remove cost-related barriers. No appointments are needed. The person needing the treatment or their parent/s can just come into our pharmacy and ask for the consultation and the pharmacist will provide a private room for the short consult. The service is completely free of charge and in addition to the products, relevant information leaflets will be provided
